Subject: CARE FOR YOUR COWORKERS

We, as a Site, keep watching COVID-19 case rates, hospitalizations, supply of personal protective equipment and other data as we continue our remobilization efforts. I want to thank the Projects and the Functional Organizations for their flexibility in remobilization planning these past few weeks and months.

As we continue bringing people back, our foundational safety principles remain. Watch out for each other, and if something doesn't feel or seem right, let your supervisor know.

Make sure you conduct the [temperature and health checks](#) prior to leaving for work. If you have a temperature or any COVID-19 symptoms, stay home, and call your supervisor. If you've been tested, regardless of if you are showing symptoms, please tell your supervisor. This is a matter of caring for your coworkers. In much the same way you wouldn't intend to put your coworker at risk for hazardous energy, a radiological or chemical hazard or a slip, trip or fall, please do not put them at risk of COVID-19 by not wearing a face covering and coming to work when you are sick or if you might be.

This has, and will continue to be, a learning process. At Hanford, we have a conservative safety posture due to the hazards we face, and we take many of those practices home. Please take the same consideration with regard to the public health hazard we continue to face.
